Congratulations to race winners and trophy recipients, certificate holders and tie wearers. As I explained during Prize Giving, whilst we awarded a great many on the day, every single person at Beech Hall is valued for their efforts and participation throughout the year. Congratulations to Milo Weller (Upper IV) on receiving his sports blazer for his exceptional participation in both British and European BMX racing and to Archie Davies (Upper II) on becoming the ISA double National Athletics Champion in the Vortex Howler throw and Year 6 4x100m Relay.

I would like to take this opportunity to celebrate the four pupils who have been recognised as underpinning our four school values: Imogen Fox (kindness), Bailee Watkins-Brown (respect), Charlie Price (integrity) and Jacob Inwood (ambition).

To Thane Davenport, recipient of the Jay Award for contribution to the school environment, leading the school's gardening projects for a number of years.

To Rory Kaye, recipient of the Hanson Award, for the person who best embodies Emerson's philosophy: "to be yourself in a

world that is constantly trying to make you something else is the greatest accomplishment".

To Freddie Johnson, recipient of the Joshua Hadley Plate for most determined sportsperson.

To Noah Richardson for his musical contribution to the school.

To Bea Adams, the Beech Hall shield for her outstanding attitude to learning.

Finally, to Austin O'Connor, worthy recipient of the Grand Griffin of Beech Hall, for the person who best represents the school's four values.

Notably, with just 182 pupils from Reception to Year 12 (soon to be Year 13), Beech Hall punches above its weight in so many areas.

The combined efforts of Bea Adams, Thain Mackintosh, Jacob Inwood and James Irwin found them placed 3rd in The Royal Society of Chemistry's (RSC) hotly contested 2025 ChemQuiz, held on 13 June at Manchester Metropolitan University. Against 33 other north-west-based schools, this was an outstanding achievement, not only for the four chemists but also our outgoing Head of Science, Mr Campbell.



Cricket has really taken off this year at Beech Hall as our youngest cricketers took on Denstone College and returned with the winners' plate, beating some of the biggest players in the north-west.

Noah Killgallon is recognised for his 60 not out against Tytherington High School, and Harry Nichols for his second place in the Y5 4x100m national athletics final, missing out on gold by one one hundredth of a second, agonisingly close.



Georgia Grundy has broken the Beech Hall TTRS record multiple times this year, finally ending the year on 0.57 seconds per question. Logan Jackson received the trophy for Accelerated Reader Champion for leaping over three years in his reading age since September!

From September to July, thank you for your participation and engagement, your effort and attitude, that have led to some truly impressive successes.

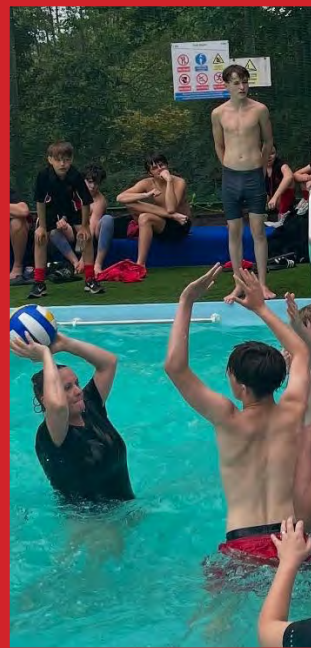
